

Title II, Sec. 251

The funds in this section were used only to meet the requirements of Title III. The relevant sections of Title III are:

Computerized Statewide Voter Registration List Requirements and Requirements for Voters Who Register by Mail - \$1,756,284

Missouri developed the Missouri Centralized Voter Registration System (MCVR). In Federal Fiscal Year 2006, payments were made for the maintenance, training, and on-going support of the MCVR system. (*State Plan, page 13, 14*)

In addition to the development of the software, the state also purchased hardware in the form of servers and networking equipment in order to deploy the application statewide. Local Election Authorities (LEAs) were granted funds to purchase such MCVR related items as desktop computer systems to access and use the statewide database, operating software and peripheral equipment (i.e. scanners and printers). Because MCVR is a browser-based system, the state also used Section 251 funds to provide Internet service to local jurisdictions that lacked the necessary access.

Accessible Equipment - \$9,673,116

Pursuant to the State Plan, Missouri established a grant process to provide Section 251 funds to LEAs in order to purchase one accessible voting system that meets the requirements of Title III of HAVA for each polling place. Each LEA was awarded funds up to \$4,150 per polling place to purchase or lease one accessible voting system for each polling place. (*State Plan, pages 11-13*)

Second Chance Equipment - \$7,394,133

Each of the 116 LEAs were granted funds to purchase equipment to meet the requirements of Section 301(a)(1) of HAVA. LEAs that were not eligible for the federal punch card buyout program were eligible for up to \$5,600 per precinct for the purchase of second chance voting equipment. LEAs that were eligible for the federal punch card buyout program were eligible for up to \$1,300 per precinct (*State Plan, page 11 - 13*)

Poll Worker Training - \$79,460

During the reporting period, Missouri provided poll worker training funds to LEAs in the amount of \$79,460 (*State Plan, page 21-22, 34*).

Interest Earned - \$1,401,443

The Missouri Secretary of State invested Title II, Sec. 251 funds during the reporting period and accrued interest in the amount of \$1,401,443.

State Matching Funds - \$2,063,868

During the Federal Fiscal Year 2006, Missouri spent \$2,063,868 in State Matching Funds. This completes the state's matching requirement under the grant.

Maintenance of Effort - \$488,368

During the State Fiscal Year 2006, the state met its Maintenance of Effort requirement of \$488,368.
