

All the above expenses fall within the broad category of *Improving the administration of elections for Federal office*. Many of the categories from above could fit into a number of the different categories of *Permissible Uses*. Salary for the HAVA Coordinator, for example, goes to pay the position of a person in the South Dakota Office of Secretary of State who is involved in a broad range of functions from reading and interpreting the Help American Vote Act of 2002 to implementing its requirements throughout the state of South Dakota, county by county, in conjunction with the Secretary of State, the Elections Director, and the guidance of the previously prepared HAVA State Plan. The biggest task for the HAVA Coordinator in 2005 was the ongoing task of researching options for HAVA required voter assist terminals. The AutoMARK was finally selected near the end of 2005. This HAVA requirement is a key part of the State Plan and one of the last requirements of HAVA to be fulfilled in South Dakota. Everything here is on target.

The biggest expense South Dakota used Title I, Section 101 money for in 2005 was for the continued development of the Statewide Voter Registration File, which is a part of the State Plan. To the existing ST 20, software programming was completed to add Social Security Administration verifications of new voter registrations. Also in 2005, ST 21 was developed, which is an automating process, connecting the statewide file with the driver license bureau and local county auditors' offices. The grants to counties mentioned above was for printers that were required to implement this process.

Now, when an applicant fills out a Driver License / I.D. Card Application at an exam station, he will find a new section included on that form offering the opportunity of seamlessly registering to vote. One signature covers the license application and voter registration. The application is entered on-site by driver license personnel into the Department of Public Safety computer system. The system automatically generates a separate voter registration application form complete with the applicant's signature, which is electronically transmitted to the appropriate County Auditor's office. The form is available the next morning for printing to paper, which is then checked and processed in exactly the same manner as any other voter registration application form. If the application is acceptable, the County Auditor will file the registration, send the voter an acknowledgement of the registration, and up-load the new or updated voter registration to the Office of Secretary of state for entry into the statewide system.

No voting equipment was purchased in calendar 2005 with Title I, Section 101 money.

A limited amount of voter education was done this off-election year. But that will be a major focus in 2006 with the implementation of the AutoMARK at every polling place in South Dakota.
