# HAVA TITLE II FUNDS

## SECTION 251

### Washington State Narrative Report Federal Fiscal year October 2005 - September 2006

#### Analysis and description of activities

#### **Title II, Section 251 Funds.**

On August 9, 2004, Washington State received \$47,195,971 under Title II, section 251 of the Help America Vote Act. The state shall use the funds provided under this section in accordance with the state plan and to carry out one or more of the following activities:

- purchasing voting equipment that meets voting system standards;
- complying with provisional voting and voting information requirements;
- implementing a computerized statewide voter registration list;
- implementing requirements for voters who register by mail; and
- other activities to improve the administration of federal elections.

In accordance with HAVA and our State plan, the following activities have been funded:

- 1. Purchasing voting equipment that meets voting system standards** – In accordance with Section 3 and Appendix F of the State plan, \$3,392,473 was spent on new voting equipment that meets the voting system standards of HAVA, section 301 for the following counties:
  - a. Adams County - \$23,834
  - b. Columbia County - \$117,531
  - c. Cowlitz County - \$25,251
  - d. Douglas County - \$20,758
  - e. Ferry County - \$143,572
  - f. Grays Harbor County - \$52,893
  - g. Jefferson County - \$22,883
  - h. King County - \$1,725,148
  - i. Kitsap County - \$43,678
  - j. Kittitas County - \$136,885
  - k. Pend Oreille County - \$10,639
  - l. Pierce County - \$920,337
  - m. San Juan County - \$118,288
  - n. Walla Walla County - \$30,776

Additionally, in accordance with Section 254 of HAVA and Section 5 of the State Plan, we spent \$23,113 on our voting system standards program. Costs include, wages, benefits, travel and equipment needs for this program.

2. **Implementing a computerized statewide voter registration database** – In accordance with Section 303 of HAVA and Section 2(d) of the State Plan, \$3,203,738 was spent on salaries and benefits, personal service contracts, good and services, travel, equipment and software to implement Washington’s state wide voter registration list.

Additionally, \$2,305,693 was paid as grants to counties for salaries and benefits, good and services, travel, equipment and software to install or upgrade county voter registrations systems. This was necessary in several counties, as current county voter registrations systems would not be compliant with the statewide voter registration database.

Total HAVA funding paid in FFY 05 to meet the HAVA requirement for a statewide voter registration database was \$5,509,431.

3. **Other activities to improve the administration of federal elections.**

- **Education Voters**– In accordance with section 4(c) of the State Plan, \$86,250 was spent on voter education and outreach activities at the state and local level
- **Voter Registration Data Base Improvements** – In accordance with Section 2 (d) of the state plan, \$895,599 was spent on enhancements to the first phase of implementing the Voter Registration Data Base (VRDB). Expenses include salaries and benefits, personal service contracts, goods and services, travel, equipment and software to implement Washington’s state wide voter registration list. This phase of the VRDB provides enhanced voter information to counties and voters throughout the state.
- **Maintaining the Voter Registration Data Base** – In accordance with Section 2(d) of HAVA, \$43,887 was spent maintaining the VRDB. Costs include wages, and benefits, travel, equipment, maintenance fees, subscription fees, software updates, source books, warranty services, and printing services. Activities associated with felon screening, social security death index, etc are also included under this category.
