

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**West Virginia's  
2004 Section 251 Expenditures  
As Amended**

West Virginia received a total of \$15,303,569.00 under Title II Section 251 of the Help America Vote Act. During the 2004 reporting cycle, interest in the amount of \$32,871.78 was realized and added to the funding under this section. Section 251 allows for states to utilize this funding for a variety of uses including but not limited to the replacement of punch card and lever machines, the purchase of accessible voting equipment, the implementation of a statewide voter registration system, and the implementation of provisional voting within the state.

In order to provide for the implementation of West Virginia's comprehensive state HAVA plan Section 1.C, Section 251 funds were used for statewide voter registration support, maintenance, training, connectivity and other minor miscellaneous expenses necessary for the implementation of HAVA and the implementation of West Virginia's statewide voter registration system. No funds were utilized in fiscal year 2005 for any other requirement found in Title III. Of the \$104,280.36 that was spent from Section 251 funds, the following chart reflects how those funds were utilized.

A majority of the above expenditures were encumbered to support and further develop the statewide voter registration system that went online in January of 2004. The majority of the cost of the program was met through Section 101 funds as Section 251 funds did not become available until after the deadline of implementation outlined in the Help America Vote Act. Specifically, the expenditures to Oxford Capital Partners LLC, was for project management. The Secretary of State's Office does not have a project manager that could be designated to this project. This was outsourced as a result, and the vendor reports directly to the HAVA Director in accordance with the State Plan.

PCC Technology was selected as the vendor to install the Statewide Voter Registration System. The majority of payments made in accordance with the contract between the vendor and the state were provided by Section 101 funds as Section 251 funds were not available for use. It is important to note that within the contract signed with PCC Technology, continued support for the system is required. A monthly fee was arranged and will continue at the end of the contract or until the requirement of any additional change orders.

The last major expense for the current reporting cycle was an amount paid to Verizon Network Integration. This expenditure was necessary to ensure that each county had an adequate connection to the state's network. The voter registration system was set up with the central storage system located at the Secretary of State's Office. This requires that each county have a connection with a sufficient bandwidth to transmit information to and from the system servers. In order to ensure that this transmittal would go smoothly the project manager coordinated the installation of switches within each county. This not only allowed for a sufficient amount of bandwidth, it also ensured the use of the network was dedicated to the voter registration system.

The maintenance of effort for election expenses as outlined in Section 7 of West Virginia's state plan states that the state will not spend less than \$42,329.00 as was spent in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000. This consisted of one election position paid out of state funds and yearly office expenses. Beginning fiscal year 2001 the elections staff grew with the addition of one additional position and an outreach staff of five that worked part time in elections outreach. The personnel services and expenses remained constant at approximately \$136,000. At the beginning of fiscal year 2005, the elections staff grew with the addition of two more positions and an election fraud unit to address election related complaints. The election fraud unit was made up of three investigators. This added approximately \$150,000 in personnel services to election related expenses met by state funds. The state will continue the expenditures in the near future. The addition of personnel alone adds greatly to the maintenance of effort. In addition, the state has funded numerous educational programs in reference to voter and HAVA outreach. Please note that exact numbers are not available as the election's division personnel and office expenses are not segregated from the general expenditures of the West Virginia Secretary of State's Office.

As West Virginia continues to implement the state plan, it is anticipated that large expenditures will be made to upgrade the voting equipment across the state and to comply with the other requirements of HAVA.
