
National Voluntary Laboratory Accreditation Program

- What is National Voluntary Laboratory Accreditation Program (NVLAP)?
 - A NIST program that provides third-party accreditation to testing and calibration laboratories in response to legislative actions or requests from government agencies or private-sector organizations.
 - Per HAVA, NIST uses NVLAP to recommend a list of test laboratories to be accredited by the EAC to carry out the testing to the VVSG.
- NVLAP Handbook (NIST SP 150-22) & Checklist
 - These documents were updated after the release of VVSG 2.0 and are being prepared for publication.
 - General updates include:
 - Adding penetration testing
 - Adding Interoperability testing (common data formats)
 - Strengthened test staff qualifications
- Status and next steps
 - NVLAP is ready to accept applications this month.



Cybersecurity Framework Profiles

- What are Cybersecurity Framework Profiles?
 - A tool that can help an organization to align and prioritize its cybersecurity activities with its business/mission requirements, risk tolerances, and resources.

Human factors-related

- What is included:
 - Design guidance
 - Testing guidance
- Topic areas covered:
 - Briefs on accessible voting features, plain language, Usercentered design, text size/contrast, gestures and scrolling, assistive technology
 - Reporting on usability testing and user centered design by vendors
 - Number of accessible voting machines
 - Usability of voter verification
 - Legibility of summary style BMD ballots

Cybersecurity-related

- What is included:
 - Goal of related-requirements
 - Vendor implementation
 - Impact to election officials
 - Changes to election landscape
- Topic areas covered:
 - Disabling wireless
 - Airgaps
 - Auditing
 - Digital signatures
 - Identifiers
 - Multi-factor authentication
 - E2E verifiable voting systems



Executive Order (EO) 14019 – Promoting Access to Voting

- Section 7 of the EO Tasks NIST to analyze barriers and publish recommendations on private and independent voting for people with disabilities, including access to:
 - National Mail Voter Registration Form
 - Voter registration
 - Voting technology
 - Voting by mail
 - Polling locations
 - Poll worker training
- Status and next steps
 - Publish for public comment
 - Prepare for final publication
