- NIST will publish draft document in the Federal Register for Public Comment

### **SYSTEMIC BARRIERS**

- 1. Struggles to meet federal standards, laws, and guidelines that address accessibility for voters.
- 2. Gaps in accessible communication and information.
- 3. Inaccessibility of paper.
- 4. Design of security solutions may not consider accessibility.
- 5. Extra obstacles encountered by voters with disabilities.





SYSTEMIC RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Create guidance to help address meeting federal standards, laws, and guidelines.
- 2. Improve dissemination, outreach, and accessibility of voting information.
- 3. Provide accessible options for the voting process.
- 4. Integrate the disability community into all aspects of voting.
- 5. Conduct research and development to promote access to voting.
