A voter tells you that they are not registered, but they want to vote.





## POLL WORKER EDITION



You notice a seal on the voting equipment is missing.





## POLL WORKER EDITION



Five minutes before the polls are set to open, there is a line 40 voters deep. You realize that you have no ballots in your supplies, and the election office isn't answering your calls.

An election observer is standing behind you, questioning every action you take and challenging every voter.






## POLL WORKER EDITION

## POLL WORKER EDITION




You pick up supplies and ballots on Election Eve and leave them locked in your car. When you head out on election morning, you discover your car has been mistakenly repossessed.

A semi-truck loaded with 250,000 aggressive bees crashes just outside your voting location. Bees are everywhere.

A voter checks in, but the poll book indicates that they've already voted by mail.





## POLL WORKER EDITION




It is Election Day, and your area is hit with an unexpected heat wave. Rolling power outages disrupt voting and cause lines. A waiting voter passes out.

Despite being urged not to have beverages at their station, another poll worker has spilled coffee on un-issued ballots. There are no usable ballots for one precinct.





## POLL WORKER EDITION



A voter makes a mistake on their ballot and requests a new one.





## POLL WORKER EDITION



The ballot scanner has a paper jam. Voters are waiting in line to deposit their ballots.





## POLL WORKER EDITION



A sudden downpour leaves voters entering your location soaking wet. One wet voter drips water on the accessible voting device, creating an electrical short. You can't get the device to turn back on.





## POLL WORKER EDITION



A voter complains that campaign staff across the street are yelling at voters and asks if you are going to do anything about it.



**POLL WORKER EDITION**

A person with what looks like a homemade "media" badge enters your voting location and insists on filming for a story they are doing about voting on their blog.

As the first voters check in after polls open, none of them are in the poll book. Something seems off.

A voter waiting in line flags you down in a panic. They show you a report of a bomb threat at your voting location on social media.
