

Errata Note: 2024 EAVS Comprehensive Report and Accompanying Dataset

February 12, 2026

The states of Indiana and Maryland requested to make corrections to their data submissions for the 2024 EAVS following the initial publication of the comprehensive report and dataset on June 30, 2025. These corrections are documented below.

2024 Election Administration and Voting Survey Dataset

The corrections listed below are reflected in Version 2 of the 2024 EAVS dataset released in February 2026.

- Indiana provided updated total number of voters removed because they were deceased (A12c) and voters removed because of a disqualifying criminal conviction or incarceration (A12d). Statewide and nationwide A12c & A12d totals did change.
- Maryland provided updated total number of confirmation notices sent to registered voters (A10a), total unreturned confirmation notices (A10f), total confirmation notices sent because voters may have moved from the address listed in their voter record (A11b), total number of voter removed because they moved outside of the jurisdiction (A12b), total number of voters removed because they were declared incompetent to vote under state law (A12f), and the total number of ballot marking devices deployed (F5c_1). Statewide and nationwide A10a, A10f, A11b, A12b, A12f, and F5c_1 totals did change.

Confirmation Notices


-Page 150-151: “Nationally, 38,803,086 confirmation notices were sent between the 2022 general election and the month before the 2024 general election, accounting for 19.1% of the active voters reported by states in 2024. This percentage was higher than what was reported by states in 2022 (13.7%) and in 2020 (14.3%). Table 1 shows that unreturned confirmation notices accounted for 68.9% of the total confirmation notices sent. ... States reported that 8.5% of confirmation notices were returned as undeliverable, and confirmation notices returned by voters accounted for the lowest percentages of confirmation notices sent (see Table 1).”

-Page 152: “Among states that tracked data on the reasons why confirmation notices were sent, the most common reported reason was as part of a routine mailing to all registered voters (**69%**), followed by confirmation notices sent to voters who may have moved from the address listed in their voter record (including notifications from the National Change of Address reports) with **25.7%** of the confirmation notices. Interestingly, **33.3%** of the states that provided data on reasons to send confirmation notices reported that a single reason of those listed accounted for more than 90% of all the confirmation notices they sent, with “Other” and notices to voters who may have changed their address being the most common.”
