The Election Supporting Technology Evaluation Program (ESTEP) at the U.S. Election Assistance Commission (EAC) has completed its review of the application package for the **VR Systems EViD** electronic poll book. The application was accepted and assigned the following unique application number: VRS-EPB-EViD-26.0.50.

Pro V&V has been identified as the lead test laboratory for this test project. Testing will be conducted to the Voluntary Electronic Poll Book Certification Requirements, Version # (VEPBCR #). If the system meets the criteria for a grant of certification, the system will be assigned the number "**VRS-EPB-EViD-26.0.50.**"

The election technology specialist assigned to oversee this testing engagement will be: Elizabeth Beatrice. Their goal is to facilitate communication between EAC staff, the manufacturer, and the test laboratory to optimize the efficiency of the certification process. This specialist will monitor the electronic poll book throughout its life cycle in the certification program, and ensure the process meets the requirements of the certification program's manuals.
