The U.S. Election Assistance Commission (EAC) notes the ES&S press release of January 28, 2008, regarding the ES&S acquisition of AutoMARK Technical Systems. As you are aware, Section 2.5.2 of the EAC's Testing and Certification Program Manual ("Manual") requires registered manufacturers to keep all registration information up to date. Manufacturers are required to submit a revised application form to the EAC within 30 days of any changes to the information required on the application form. Manufacturers remain registered participants in the program during this update period.

As such, please update all registration information (Section 2.3.1 of the Manual) that has changed as a result of the acquisition of AutoMARK Technical Systems by March 1, 2008. Failure to meet this deadline may result in the issuance of a notice of non-compliance and possible suspension of registration. Furthermore, we ask that you provide information regarding the impact of this acquisition on: 1) AutoMARK products currently under test with the EAC by other registered manufacturer, and 2) the pending application for testing submitted by AutoMARK on December 13, 2007.

Please let me know if you have any questions regarding this letter or the information that must be provided. Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated as the information provided will serve to prevent any undue confusion or delay of current certification engagements that include the AutoMARK product.
