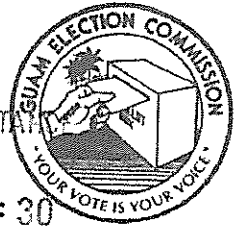



Once again, monies were spent on payment towards Legal Counsel who once again reviewed and readied himself for any challenges, complaints, or objections to HAVA procedures, which have been implemented and activated. Monies were also spent on updating the GEC regarding HAVA and ways to improve the Guam HAVA State Plan. In FY05, the GEC monies were spent on updating the Guam HAVA State Plan. The GEC, in FY04, had experienced its first HAVA driven federal election and was preparing for the general election. Included in this figure are expenses for personnel cost including benefits.	\$213,758.26
§254 Voter education, election official education and training and poll worker training which will assist the State in meeting the requirements of Title III	HAVA procedures were implemented in the primary election of FY04 (September 2004) and tested again in the general election of FY05 (November 2004). During the remaining FY05 and calendar year 2006, the GEC continued its focus on educating the public through advertisements, television segments, public outreach at malls and other public sponsored events. In addition, in calendar year 2006, the primary and general election of 2006 was held. The GEC again conducted extensive training for poll workers in how to instruct and communicate with voters and proper procedures to ensure the each voter's rights were not violated during the election process. To ensure that the education process was efficient and successfully the GEC acquired the necessary supplies to conduct voter outreach and educate the poll workers and provide materials during election day. Included in this figure are expenses for personnel cost including benefits.	\$110,437.07
§301 Voting System Improvements	The DRE units in FY04's primary election were met with both excitement and concerns. In FY05's general election, the GEC continued its efforts to familiarize the general voting population with the DRE units. Monies were also spent in updating the audio portion of the DRE units for the general election of 2004. For the remaining FY05 and calendar year 2006, the GEC also continued its efforts toward developing and maintaining its website. The usefulness of the website was evident throughout the remaining FY05 year and calendar year 2006. The website was utilized by voters both here in Guam and throughout the world. Voters used the website to gather information about the 2006 Elections and inquiry about absentee voting. The majority of the monies spent went towards purchasing new voter verifiable audit paper trail machines. These machines were used in FY05. Included in this figure are expenses for personnel cost including benefits.	\$481,839.59
§302 Provisional voting and voting information requirements	The GEC introduced provisional voting in FY04. The GEC continued to use provisional voting in the 2006	\$ 11,472.62

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	<p>Elections. Provisional voting continues to add the GEC in its outreach to qualified voters who are not registered to vote. This is done with the information that is obtained on the day of the elections which includes telephone numbers and mailing information. The GEC continued with educating the voting population and the poll workers with provisional voting. In its efforts to continue the education process, the GEC acquired necessary supplies and materials that needed to be replenished for the FY05 general election. Included in this figure are expenses for personnel cost including benefits.</p>	
§303 Computerized statewide voter registration list requirements and requirements for voters who register by mail.	<p>For the remaining of FY05 and calendar year 2006, the GEC continued towards its goal of acquiring and implementing its centralized voter registration system. The majority of the monies used went towards the purchase of the centralized voter registration system and training for 9 staff members. The GEC continues to communicate with the various government agencies required by HAVA in order to complete the criteria for the acquisition of the centralized voter registration system. Included in this figure are expenses for personnel cost including benefits.</p>	\$605,980.48
§402 Establishment of state based administrative complaint procedures to remedy grievances.	<p>The GEC began the process of incorporating HAVA requirements in its current administrative complaint form in 2004 and beginning of FY05. By the 2006 Elections, the GEC had begun to educate the public on the forms availability. For the 2006 Elections, the GEC incorporated the new forms into its training with the poll workers and with the materials provided to each polling site on election day. The GEC also used monies to purchase materials for education and election day.</p>	\$ 2,778.99
§704 Improvements to Military/Off-Island Absentee Voting	<p>Beginning in the 2004 Elections, the GEC was actively educating the public of the availability of absentee voting. This was done through advertisement and during public outreach education. The GEC was also actively processing off-island and military absentee ballot applications. This process was continued during the 2006 Elections. The GEC used the monies for materials, supplies and education. Included in this figure are expenses for personnel cost including benefits.</p>	\$ 55,592.60
§261 Assuring Access for Individuals with Disabilities	<p>From the onset of HAVA, one of the GEC's main goals has been to insure accessibility to voters with disabilities. The GEC has spent monies to survey and upgrade the polling sites used during the 2004 and 2006 General Election. Monies have also been spent on voter outreach to the disabled community and on educating the public about the available voting option for persons with disabilities. Included in this figure are expenses for personnel cost including benefits. (GEC has used HAVA Title II funds to subsidize HAVA 261 budget until the funds from HAVA 261 is received.)</p>	\$226,631.52
