

Report to EAC (continued from FSR): Title II, 251 FedFY 2006 by South Dakota

**12. Remarks** to line 10c: Earned \$267,407.87 interest on requirements payments during this reporting period; earned \$315,309.57 total interest to date. Total appropriated for State 5% match = \$610,358.05. Of this amount, \$198,405.80 was appropriated by the State legislature and spent on the statewide electronic voter file. South Dakota counties fulfilled the remainder of the 5% match requirement by setting aside \$411,952.20 in individual county-held accounts reserved for Title III expenses. Use of these reserved funds are required to be reported to the State. The State did not require counties to put their 5% match reserved balances into interest bearing accounts. During FedFY06, 22 counties spent a total of \$101,262.11 from their county-held accounts. Balance of these accounts ended the year at \$246,792.48. Total State maintenance of effort (MOE) spent during State fiscal year 2006 was \$68,776 and in State fiscal year 2007 is projected to be \$72,600.

Because the voting machines purchased by the State for itself and on behalf of South Dakota counties was less than anticipated, the portion of the Title II money in the State-held account reserved for individual counties began with a total balance of \$3,235,652.80. This account earns interest credited to individual counties.
