

Voting System Modernization RFI  
Questions & Answers

1. **Which vendor provides the current voting system?**  
The current voting system was manufactured by Danaher. The vendor who services the machines is Electec.
2. **When was the current system acquired?**  
The voting machines were acquired from the summer of 2001 through the summer of 2002.
3. **Estimated cost of the new System?**  
One of the purposes of this RFI is for the City to gauge costs in the current marketplace
4. **How will the Office acquire the System (RFP/State Contract/Sole Source)?**  
Per page 5 of the RFI, the City intends to post the final project scope as a Request for Proposals (RFP) and the City intends to contract with a vendor for full implementation
5. **Estimated time frame in which the Office may acquire the System?**  
Per page 3 of the RFI, the City is looking for a system that can be implemented by the Municipal Primary Election in 2017.
6. **Is the City interested in receiving an RFI response from a company that is recognized as a world-expert in elections and yet does not have a product certified and licensed in the State of PA?**  
The City can only purchase voting technology that is licensed and certified by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
7. **The submission requirements note that the *Response to Suggested Activities* should be limited to 4 pages. Would it be possible to extend the page limit? For example, if our *Company Profile* (also limited to 4 pages) is only 3 pages, could we add an extra page to our *Response to Suggested Activities*?**  
We will not penalize for not adhering to the suggested page limits, but ask that the page limit be used if possible.
