

Charles Stewart III

Charles Stewart III is the Kenan Sahin Distinguished Professor of Political Science at MIT, where he has been on the faculty since 1985. Professor Stewart has written numerous books and scholarly articles about elections, Congress, and American political history. For over a decade, he has been the MIT director of the Caltech/MIT Voting Technology Project, an interdisciplinary program founded in late 2000 aimed at preventing a recurrence of the technological lapses that put the 2000 presidential election in question. He is currently principal investigator of the Polling Place of the Future project, which is funded by the Democracy Fund to encourage a better understanding of the dynamics that lead to long lines at the polls and to adapt techniques from management science to the problem of allocating resources to polling places.
