U.S. Election Assistance Commission

Our short-term objectives

- Transform EAC from a start-up to a fully staffed and operational organization
- Staff up in key areas, programmatic and operational
- Complete this while building up our research and clearinghouse activities and getting voting systems certified

How did we achieve them?

We built a strong financial team

- **Senior-level grants director** administers HAVA funds
- **Accounting director** oversees the accounting and financial reporting process
- **CFO** ensures we're compliant with federal requirements and using resources efficiently

The bottom line: EAC staff can focus more on providing quality technical assistance to election officials

We're tackling financial audit findings

- Clearly defined roles and responsibilities of commissioners and senior staff
- Approved a strategic plan that includes performance-based budgeting
- Restructured the Commission so it operates more effectively
- Developed policies and procedures for program areas and internal operations


We took action to expedite the certification process

- We doubled the size of our voting systems staff
- This includes two **computer engineers** with expertise in voting system technology
- We also launched the **Cooperative Testing Initiative**, which will help us move faster by avoiding redundant testing
- We're revising the 2005 VVSG to aid the creation of **uniform test suites** and other measures that will relieve bottlenecks in the test process

Next Steps

- Continue improving internal controls and compliance with federal financial regulations
- Fully implement program and administrative policies and procedures
- Continue advancing the testing process as quickly as possible without compromising quality

Testing and Certification



Recent Program Milestones

- Certified first voting system (MicroVote EMS 4.0)
- Expect two more systems to complete testing soon
 - ES&S Unity 3.2
 - Premier Assure 1.2
- Released comprehensive test lab accreditation manual
- Hired two full-time computer engineers who will:
 - answer technical questions from election officials and vendors
 - help test lab vendors understand how to test specialized systems
 - keep the technical review and approval process moving forward

Definitions

Testing Standard:	Identifies the set of standards/guidelines which the voting system is being tested against. Currently, voting systems may only be submitted for testing to the 2005 Voluntary Voting System Guidelines (2005 VVSG). Systems submitted for testing prior to December 15, 2007, also had the option of being tested against the 2002 Voting System Standards (2002 VSS).
VSTL:	Accredited EAC voting system test laboratory (VSTL) selected by the manufacturer to perform testing and other laboratory actions consistent with the EAC's Certification Program Manual.
Testing Application:	Date on which the manufacturer submitted the voting system's application for certification testing. It does not indicate the date on which the application package was approved by the EAC.
Test Plan:	Document created prior to testing that outlines the scope and nature of testing, items to be tested, test approach, resources needed to perform testing, test tasks, risks and schedule.
Test Report:	Document that provides the results of a voting system's testing conducted by an EAC accredited VSTL, along with the VSTL's recommendation regarding certification.

Revision of the 2005 VVSG

- Revisions will streamline the process by:
 - aiding the creation of test suites that promote uniform, consistent and faster testing
 - providing clarification in key areas that often cause confusion and slow the process
- Revisions allow us to improve the process before the release of the next iteration of the VVSG
- We will hold a HAVA-mandated public comment period before any revisions are adopted

Election Operations Assessment

- A scientifically-founded assessment of all types of voting systems conducted by the University of South Alabama
- It will inform EAC decisions on the next iteration of the VVSG
- It will help officials make informed decisions about voting system purchases
- The first of three phases is complete

NIST's UOCAVA Electronic Voting Research

- Best practices for requesting and transmitting blank ballots via fax, e-mail and Internet
- Security considerations for remote electronic UOCAVA voting systems

To be completed by December 2009

Communications Initiative

- A collaborative effort between EAC and stakeholders to improve communication about the testing and certification program
- It will base action on feedback from stakeholders on issues of greatest concern
- This will ensure officials are getting the information they need

Cooperative Testing Initiative

- A collaborative effort between the EAC and states
- The goal is to reduce the amount of redundant testing between the state and federal testing processes, resulting in cost savings

HAVA Funds



HAVA Requirements Payments just got easier

- We've consolidated the 2008 and 2009 funds
- States will need to provide only one HAVA State Plan to claim funds
- This will streamline the process and reduce red tape
- We will issue guidance on the process soon

States will receive more technical assistance

- Workshops and training sessions on how to spend and report on spending
- Help with facilitating clean audits
- Risk assessment plan and guidance on how to identify red flags or areas of high risk
- These initiatives will begin in the third and fourth quarters

\$20.4 million of FY 2008 payments have been disbursed







Elections Research



2008 Election Day Survey

- Scheduled for release Fall 2009
- 100 percent state response rate compared to 96 percent in 2006 and 93 percent in 2004
- Survey responses are more complete than in previous years
- Why? Officials said the questions were clearer, and consultants were on call to answer questions

Final NVRA report will be released June 30


Released four reports last year

- Clearinghouse activities will be guided by a policy that will be in place this year


Plain Language Initiative

- Next project will be simplifying the Election Operations Assessment project


EAC Operations Budget

- **Voting system program** (17 percent increase over 2009)
- **Clearinghouse** activities
- **Additional elections research**, including:
 - EDS
 - Voter registration databases
 - Free or reduced postage for absentee ballots
- **Grantmaking** for FY 2009
 - HAVA requirements payments - \$100 million
 - Voting technology improvements research - \$5 million
 - Logic and accuracy testing - \$1 million
 - College poll worker - \$750,000
 - Student mock elections - \$300,000
