During the reporting period, Texas continued to use funding to make security enhancements to its HAVA-mandated voter registration system ("TEAM"). The Texas Secretary of S tate's Office ("SOS") worked with its voter registration system software vendor to make security updates to the TEAM system, including election management integration. SOS a lso partnered with the Texas Department of Information Resources ("DIR") to provide election security assessments to Texas counties through DIR's Managed Security Services program. All 254 counties received an assessment prior to the 2022 federal election. Also through that program, SOS used funds for remediation services and darknet monitoring services. Lastly, all of the counties were eligible to apply for an Election Security sub-grant of up to \$120,000. Counties used the funds for any of the approved grant activities, in cluding voting system upgrades, cyber security enhancements, and voter registration system improvements.

Through the ESA program and various webinars, Texas has trained numerous local election and IT staff members. In addition, SOS has developed a number of templates and procedural documents to assist counties with the development of election security policies and procedures. In addition, through the sub-grants to the counties, many counties used the funds for election security training and training on newly acquired voting equipment.

Over the course of the HAVA Election Security project period beginning in March 2018, SOS has secured a number of cash and in-kind matching sources. First, the state appropri ated \$1,162,630.00 in matching funds during the 86th Regular Session of the Texas Legislature. Second, the sub-grants to the counties require a 20% match over a certain amoun t. Not all of the match has been recorded as of yet because the counties have not expended and reported all of the sub-grant funds. It is anticipated that some of the sub-grants will remain unexpended and roll back to the state. In that instance, the remaining required match will not come from the counties but from other sources. Lastly, the 87th Texas Legisl ature appropriated \$38.3MM to certain counties for the conversion or acquisition of auditable voting machines (RAVM). During the current report period, the state has expended in excess of \$26MM. However, for purposes of meeting the match requirement the state is only recording just over \$4MM. The match breakdown for the current report period is as follows: Subgrants: \$550,573.07 State Cash Match: \$390,699.75 RAVM: \$4,046,255.76
