To Whom It May Concern:

The purpose of this correspondence is to report on the Texas HAVA Title I, Section 101 financial activity for the time period covering October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019 as required by the U.S. Election Assistance Commission. Specifically, this report will provide the following:

- A list of expenditures for each Budget Category to which the state allocated funds on the EAC Budget Worksheet with a total of all those expenditures for the year.
- An analysis and description of activities by Budget Category to which the state allocated funds on the EAC Budget Worksheet and how those activities meet the plans outlined in the Program Narrative.
- Descriptions of the major categories of subgrant activities local voting districts will accomplish
 with the funds (if the state subgranted funds during the reporting period to local election
 districts).
- A description of any security training conducted and the number of participants.
- The number and type of any voting system-related equipment purchased with HAVA funds.

The Federal Financial Report for Title I, Section 101 ("HAVA Election Security Grant") is attached to this report.

Program Narrative Analysis

Under the "Election Auditing and Cyber Vulnerabilities: Security Services for Counties" section of the Texas 2018 HAVA Election Security Grant Funding Narrative, Texas stated it was in the process of acquiring a subscription for a cybersecurity training course, which will be made available, free of charge, to election officials in all 254 counties. Texas acquired the software in August 2018. Although funding was not expended in FY2019, election officials did utilize the training. Texas also

hired two election security trainers to provide technical assistance to counties regarding election security. Texas will update the Texas 2018 HAVA Election Security Grant Funding Narrative accordingly.

Under the "Voter Registration Systems and Management and Election Management: Security Enhancements and Integration" section of the narrative, Texas specified that it would use funding to make security enhancements to its HAVA-mandated voter registration system ("TEAM"). During the report period, the Texas Secretary of State's Office ("SOS") worked with its voter registration system software vendor to make security updates to the TEAM system, including election management integration.

Subgrants

Although no subgrants have been made, SOS has partnered with the Texas Department of Information Resources (DIR) to provide election security assessments to any Texas county through DIR's Managed Security Services program as described in the "Election Auditing and Cyber Vulnerabilities: Security Services for Counties" section of the program narrative. \$1,223,709 was paid in FY2019 covering 34 counties.

Training

As mentioned above, the state acquired cybersecurity training software made available to election officials in all 254 counties. Approximately 900 officials utilized the training in FY2019.

Voting System-related Equipment

No voting system equipment purchases were made during the report period.
