The CARES Act Funding was very instrumental in the success of the 2020 General Election. The General Election was administered in accordance with the Governor's Covid-19 Proclamation and in compliance with the use of CARES Act Funding. A full accounting of the usage of the CARES Act funding is as follows.

Personnel: Additional election office staff were hired on short-term contract to assist in the additional preparations and efforts for the GE amidst Covid-19. The Election Action Plan included the opening of significantly more polling stations in order to disburse crowds into smaller groups in each voting district. With the additional polling stations, more poll workers than usual were hired and trained to administer the election. Other contract workers hired on for the purpose of planning and executing a successful GE included health experts, professional cleaners and security officers. These additional personnel played major and vital roles in the success of the 2020 General Election.

Materials & Supplies: Equipping each polling station with sufficient materials and supplies to maintain a sanitary and safe area/polling station was of the utmost importance. Office supplies and materials that were necessities for accommodating our short-term contract hires were also purchase and proved a good investment not just for the 2020 General Election but for future elections.

Training and Travel: American Samoa consists of 5 inhabited islands. Commercial travel between the islands was and is suspended by declaration of the American Samoa Governor. In order to ensure the participation of the outer islands in the General Election, the Government and Election office partnered up to charter a flight and boat trips between the islands to ensure all residents of the territory were afforded the opportunity to vote, and poll workers on each island were trained properly to administer the election.

Communication: Outreach programs for the purpose of getting the public informed about the changes and safety measures incorporated into the administering of the 2020 General Election was a huge success. With the CARES Act funding, we were able to utilize all avenues of communication available to the territory.

Voting process: By declaration of the American Samoa Governor, the territory's borders were closed and caused many of the territory's residents to be stranded off-island. The election office launched a Covid-19 absentee voting initiative that allowed for all registered voters off-island to vote by mail-in absentee voting. This initiative, fully funded but the CARES Act saw a 120% increase in absentee voting.

The CARES Act fund along with the efforts by the American Samoa Government and the Election Office staff is credited with the success of the 2020 General Election.
