In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the state of Kentucky was awarded CARES Act funding to alleviate security and sanitation concerns during the Primary and General Elections. During this unprecedented time the Bluegrass state saw a record voter turnout for the Primary Election, held Tuesday, June 23, 2020.

The majority of the vital funding used to date was attributed to the voting processes and the update of the existing voter equipment. To assure the voters the most secure experience, the State Board of Elections initiated immediate software upgrades as well as the addition of new voting equipment to accommodate the higher voter turnout. To further this objective and implement more absentee voting options, printing and shipping expenses were incurred at a higher rate than in previous circumstances. With the rise in voter turnout additional ballots and activation cards were purchased as an emergency necessity. Secure ballot boxes were also provided and installed in each of the 120 county clerk's offices to offer the voter additional resources to cast their ballot.

As precinct options decreased the need for additional election office staff in each county was required. The attempt to keep working conditions as healthy as possible was aided by the additional funding to purchase iPads for registration and one use items to cut back on cross-contamination between voters and staff. Costs were incurred to offer training on the new procedures that had been implemented.

At this time there are outstanding invoices associated with the purchases stated above but have been included as estimates in the financial reporting of this grant.
