In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the state of Kentucky was awarded CARES Act funding to alleviate security and sanitation concerns during the Primary and General Elections. During this unprecedented time the Bluegrass state saw a record voter turnout for the General Election, held Tuesday, November 3, 2020.

The majority of this vital funding used to date was expended for the Primary Election on June 23, 2020 but all remaining funds have been utilized for the General Election. During the Primary Election, voting equipment was updated in an effort to streamline the voting processes throughout the state. Determination of the counties was based on need at the start of the pandemic. The remaining counties were updated during the General Election. This included updating software across the board to accommodate the high voter turnout.

Printing and shipping costs have been at an all-time high due to the continued increase of absentee ballot voting. As a result of more absentee voters, the need for additional postage was necessary. Although the numbers for absentee ballots were lower during the General Election than in the Primary, the higher voter turnout for in-person voting increased the number of ballots and activation cards that were purchased.

The highest need for the state of Kentucky for this CARES Act funding was the necessity of additional staffing. Regulations and CDC guidelines required more staff to be acquired, as well as the redistribution of job duties for current staff in place. With higher absentee ballots to process and record voter turnout, the staffing costs were a top priority to the State Board of Elections and their county clerks.

At this time there is still a balance remaining to meet the state match requirement. A proposed plan has been implemented to meet that match by paying throughout each quarter of the current Fiscal Year. The Agency anticipates that the State Match requirement will be met by the end of Fiscal Year 2021 on June 30, 2020. The original grant was received in April 2020 and will be required to be met by April 2022. At this time this CARES Act grant has been fully expended and no further expenditures will be made.
