Michigan's Primary Election for congressional offices was held on August 4, 2020. As stated in the grant request letter provided to the EAC in April 2020, the \$11,247,753 Michigan received in CARES Act funding would be used to prevent, prepare for and respond to COVID-19 by working with our local jurisdictions to increase voting by mail in the August and November federal elections and ensure that in-person voting is safe and healthy.

For the August election, this was accomplished by completing the following activities:

- 1. Absentee voter applications were mailed to all registered voters that were not already on the permanent absentee voter list.
- 2. Providing additional equipment and supplies to assist locals in processing absentee voter ballots and applications such as ballot drop boxes, ballot envelopes, automatic letter openers, postage meters, envelope folders and mailing equipment.
- 3. A public media campaign to educate voters on their right to vote by mail.

As of August 24, 2020, \$6,635,744.55 of CARES Act funding has been spent or obligated for these activities. Please note that this does not include all the costs for these activities since not all the bills and reimbursement requests have been received.

Michigan has also contributed \$185,647.92 towards the match from donated PPE, staff time for an election worker volunteer program and to distribute the PPE to local jurisdictions. Please note that there is also some additional match that still needs to be calculated.

Even though the Election went extremely well given the record-breaking turnout, our biggest challenge for November is working with the Michigan Legislature to make necessary and sensible changes to Michigan election law, including allowing the processing of absentee ballots prior to election day and accepting absentee ballots postmarked by election day for the two days immediately after the election.
